East Tilbury will use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of their physical education (PE), physical activity and sport.

- We aim to develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport that your school provides
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Key Achievements to Date:

- Retention of Highly skilled PE Teacher who leads on all areas of the PE curriculum and extra-curricular activities.
- Specialist PE lead models and upskills for all staff members therefore building capacity.
- Specialist Sports companies retained yearly and activities regularly reviewed with new options selected to provide variety and increase participation.
- Subscription to the Thurrock Schools Sports Partnership has continued for the last 9 years and will continue to do so. More competitions and wider range of activities are added every year, including MAT activities, SEND activities and those for our Disadvantaged pupils.
- Gold Sports Mark achieved on numerous occasions, most recently 2018/19 cohort.
- Your school games Thurrock SSP recognition award 2019-2020
- Continue to use the expertise of TA's who are level 3 trained in Netball to deliver after school netball training for years 3/ 4 and 5/6 pupils. Year 5/6 team continues to have high success when competing within the borough.
- PE and Physical activity is having a positive impact on attendance and behaviour

Areas for Further Improvement:

- To further raise the profile of PE within the school and within the local community.

- To purchase new and safe equipment to ensure the safety and full engagement of all of our pupils including SEND and Disadvantaged pupils. E.g. adapted equipment to allow more enjoyment, accelerated learning, engagement and progress.
- Specialist coaches working with identified groups to raise self-esteem, social skills and instill healthy lifestyle choices.
- Competition clothing to further raise the profile of PE in the school and local community, raise self-esteem, pride in our school and ownership of their achievements.

Our intended aim to spend the sports Premium funding 2020/2021 in the following ways to improve PE and sport participation and to enable pupils to develop and sustain a healthy, active lifestyle:

- To further educate teaching staff in an area of PE they feel less confident in with online CPD training.
- Fund year 1 scooter training
- Top-up swimming for Year 6 for those who do not reach the NC 25m requirement in summer term providing swimming can take place- government still require this information to be recorded by the end of 2021.
- Partially fund Bike-ability Level 1 and 2 courses for Year 4-6 and Balance-ability courses for Year 1-2. Pupils learn to be safe when cycling on the road to and from school and when transitioning to secondary school.
- To improve the quality of planning and teaching across the whole school with the use of up to date Val Sabin SOW.
- Continue to improve self-esteem and attainment within PE extra curricula clubs for girls and boys in KS2 within spring and summer term by employing external coaches in areas of sport not currently offered within the school setting. E.g. street dance.
- Purchase SEND equipment for delivery within gross motor sessions and within PE lessons.
- Purchase and update more outdoor PE facilities- Long jump and basketball installation
